

Nebojša Petrović is a social psychologist and a professor at University of Belgrade, Faculty of Psychology. His main area of study and research includes political and peace psychology and especially topics on reconciliation, authoritarianism, but also violence in youth sport and other themes where it is possible to apply psychological knowledge in explaining social problems and issues. He teaches *Social Psychology* and *Methodology* at undergraduate and postgraduate level, and *Psychology of Peacebuilding and Reconciliation* and *Political Psychology* at PhD level. He has published three books as the only one author *The paths of research of authoritarianism*, *Psychological foundations of reconciliation* and *Elements of cross-cultural psychology* and several others as coauthor or author of chapters. He has published many papers in peer review journals: from Serbian journals: *Psychology* (ex member of the editorial board), *Sociology* (in editorial board now) and others, and also in leading international journals such as *Journal of Personality and Social Psychology*, *Group Processes and Intergroup Relations* and other. He has presented his papers at many scientific conferences. Nebojša Petrovic was a member of several international professional associations such as the *International Society for Political Psychology*. He was twice a visiting researcher at the University of Vienna, and he is a regular (almost each year since 2005) visiting researcher at the *London School of Economics*, where, among other things, he developed several syllabi of university courses. He has participated in many international scientific projects including FP7 project: Focus Balkans 2007-2011, COST project: Social psychological dynamics of historical representations in the enlarged European Union 2012-2016, DfID project Justice and Security Research Programme 2011-2015, NSF project Approaches to the Aftermath of Intergroup Violence: Effects of Impunity, Trials, and Truth Commissions on Intergroup Peace and Reconciliation Between Victims and Perpetrators 2013-2016. He has close collaborations with colleagues from universities of Oxford, Massachusetts, New York New School, Southern California, Boston, London School of Economics, Tübingen, etc.
